



**A EUMUNDI FAMILY'S NOBLE CONTRIBUTION TO THE A.I.F. RANKS.**

Three sons and three stepsons of Mr. G. H. Cooke, head teacher of the State school at Eumundi, Queensland, Reading from left to right:—Top row: Signaller William E. Cooke, 22nd Reinforcements 15th Battalion (now in England); Private Herbert Wm. Cooke, late of C Company of the original 15th Battalion, killed in action at Quinn's Post, Gallipoli; Signaller Albert Edward Cooke, C Company, 48th Battalion, severely wounded at Pozieres, France, in August last, not yet recovered.

Bottom row: Private Jabez Abraham, 4th Battalion, died of multiple wounds received at Pozieres, France, in August last; Private Gilbert H. Abraham, C Company, 15th Battalion, wounded at Gallipoli soon after landing, returned to duty and fought for some months on the Peninsula; sent to England, then to France; wounded at Pozieres, since returned to duty.
